Study: Spring/Easter	 Ask your child these questions: How do we celebrate Easter? Why do we celebrate Easter and the resurrection of Jesus? God created the day and night. On one side of a piece of paper draw a big sun and color it the colors of the sun with a blue sky. On the backside of the paper draw a big full moon and a dark night sky with stars. Label each side, Day & Night. 	 During your morning or afternoon time outside talk with your child about all the things God made for us. The green grass, the blue sky, the animals, and nature all around us. What do they see? What was one thing on your walk you loved to see? Ask your child to draw a picture of his/her favorite part of your time outside? Did God make that for us? 	 Find a picture book at home. Go on a "Made by God Scavenger Hunt." Look at all the pictures. What are some things you can find that God created for us? Are there any pictures that remind you of Spring time? Ask your child to show you the pictures he/she found that remind him/her of spring or that reminds him/her of something special God made. 	 Watch the virtual story <u>Spring is Here</u><u>Now with Bear and</u><u>his Friends</u>. Will Bear wake up for spring? What animals were in the story? Can you reenact what some of the spring animals did to move? Be a bear waking up for spring. Fly like a butterfly and ladybug. Swim like a fish. Hop like a bunny. Run like a chipmunk. Climb like a raccoon. 	Create a springtime chick using your own handprint. You can trace your hand on yellow colored paper or you can use yellow paint to stamp your chick handprint. Draw two chick circle eyes, a triangle beak, and two straight legs. Display your baby chick at home for all to see or give it to a loved one for Easter.





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




