Draw a picture of your dad's dream car. □ Have dad build with you (use Legos, blocks, sticks or rocks from outside). 	 Play outside with your dad. Play catch, basketball, kickball, go on a bike ride, or walk. Pretend to be dad. Walk and talk like him and have your dad pretend to be you. Use your imagination to play castle. Is dad the King? Are you the knight or princess? Or are you the dragon!? Create an acrostic poem using your dad's name. Think of words that begin with each letter in your dad's name to describe him (see page 2 for an example).
