Project Option #1	Students are to examine art that commemorates the lives of Mother Teresa and Gandhi locally at the Cleveland Cultural Gardens and then find two other memorials to these heroes, or create a memorial of their own.			
Project Option #2	Students are to write a letter advocating an issue they are passionate about to an elected official.			
Project Option #3	Students are to create an original prayer about a virtue related to one of the great souls.

Week Project

Choice of one of these three options for your cumulative project for this week's hero study. Projects will be submitted to the Classroom by Saturday, May 23 at 5 pm.

OPTION #1: MONUMENTAL GREATNESS

Art can memorialize the work of great people. Both Mother Teresa and Gandhi are commemorated in sculpture here in Cleveland at the Cleveland Cultural Gardens (CCG) in the <u>Albanian</u> and <u>Indian</u> Federation Gardens, respectively. Visit the gardens and capture a personal photograph with each statue from the Cultural Gardens (a great family outing).

Second Part (choose one):

- A. Find two other online, artistic representations of each Great Soul. Share your images with captions to describe each. These can be of any medium -- murals, monuments, shrines, paintings, etc -- and not limited to sculpture. With these two additional representations share a caption to describe the work. Include the artist, the medium, where it can be found, and the purpose or intent of the work. This can be done on a Google Slide or a Doc.
- B. Create an image yourself featuring both Great Souls together. This artwork can be sketched, drawn, or painted.

Exceptional work will include the necessary photos, have a well-written caption with all the necessary elements (artist, medium, location, purpose) or a well-presented product of the Great Souls together. Entries will be typed, have few or no spelling or grammatical errors in the presentation. The content is focused and to the point.



OPTION #2: ADVOCATING FOR CHANGE

Working against injustice often takes the form of advocacy, or working to influence decision making. In the United States, many people advocate through writing a letter to an elected official.

You are to write a representative about a current issue that is important to you. A guide to writing letters of advocacy from Catholic Relief Services can be found here.

Grades 7 & 8: Write an advocacy letter regarding a change in international governmental policy.

Grades 5 & 6: Write a letter about a change you would like to see in schools.

Things to consider in your letter:

- Follow the sample business letter format. A template can be found here.
- Be respectful and sincere
- Clearly state the purpose of your letter.
- Say who you are.
- Keep your letter to one page.
- Use specific examples and evidence to support your position.
- State what it is you want to be done.
- Thank the member for taking the time to read your letter.

An exceptional letter will be typed, will have an appropriate greeting, and have a closing which is appropriate for a business letter. There should be few or no spelling or grammatical errors in the letter. The content of the letter should be focused and the tone should be professional.



OPTION #3: PRAYERFUL REFLECTION

Prayer can change the world. Create a poetic prayer in the spirit of each of the Great Souls, then record yourself praying it. Include a statement to the purpose of your prayer and tell what your process was in creating it. This can be done on the video or sent in a Google Doc.

Things to consider in your prayer:

- 1. Begin by addressing who you are offering your prayer to. You can write your prayer to God or ask for the intercession of a saint. In addressing God, think of the many names we have for God, such as Father, Lord, Jesus, Creator, Holy Spirit, Good Shepherd are a few. Then decide which would fit best for the prayer you are offering.
- 2. Choose a particular idea to reflect on. Consider a virtue of one of the great souls or an issue that they were passionate about.
- 3. Use language and word choice to add poetic elements to your words.
- 4. Practice and rehearse your presentation before recording to ensure that your words can be understood.

Both Great Souls were great practitioners of prayer and meditation. The resources below explore each of their spiritual lives. This may help to inspire you and discover a topic for your prayer.
