## RECOMMENDED SUMMER IXL MATH ASSIGNMENTS

Unless otherwise indicated, the exercises should be completed at the grade level your child is now finishing. Please note that IXL occasionally adds skills over the summer, which affects the skill numbers. If skill numbers do not match what we have, follow the description of the skill, rather than the skill number. Additionally, any skills related to the ones listed will provide good practice.
